ABOUT COLLEGE...

The college offers undergraduate programmes in Arts, Commerce, Science, Accountancy and Financial Management, Management Studies, Information Technology and Computer Science along with post-graduate programmes in Commerce, Mathematics, Information Technology, Zoology, Chemistry and Computer Science. Along with UG and PG programmes, the Ph.D. programmes in Accountancy and Zoology are available in the college under University of Mumbai. GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

Student seeking admission for FY (B.A., B.Com, B.Sc. CS, IT, BMS, BAF) should enroll / register at the website of University of Mumbai - <https://muugadmission.samarth.edu.in/>. Admission is given as per merit and other norms as laid down by the University, the Government or / and the Management, from time to time. The Principal reserves the right to amend/modify the guidelines regarding admission, as and when such amendments/modifications are received from the Government/University or the Management, as the case may be. They will be accordingly notified on the Notice Board of the College.

AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

- **The student who seeks admission in the College should meet the Principal/Concerned Authority first alongwith the parents / guardian. Then, he / she will be given admission in the College. Applications sent by post or in the hands of others person will not be entertained.**
- At the time of admission itself, the student should pay complete amount of first semester fees.
- The fees for second semester should be paid at the beginning of the semester.
- If a student needs relaxation in the time duration allotted for the payment of fees, then he / she must apply in prescribed format to the Principal. The relaxation may be given for genuine reasons under certain circumstances only. By the end of given time, fees should be paid without hesitation.
- In case of any change in the fees, the same will be notified as and when received from the University / Government.
- Employed students should mention the detailed information like salary, duty-hours, etc. in the admission form. They must produce NOC of their employer, with the admission form. If a student gets a job after admission, he / she should inform the college within 15 days, in writing. Such students should attend minimum 75% of the lectures / Tutorials / Practicals Semesterwise. If he / she fails to complete 75% attendance, admission is liable to be cancelled.

Note - Admission of the students coming from other colleges at S.Y. & T.Y. level will be confirmed only after receiving online Transfer Certificate from previous College.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

F.Y. B.A. / B.Com. / B.Sc. -

Admission in the above classes is subjected to availability of seats in the College.

A candidate seeking admission to the three year integrated course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts, Commerce or Science must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (SY Junior College/HSC) examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or an examination recognized as equivalent with subjects, as specified by the University, in Arts, Commerce or Science streams.

A student who passed an examination equivalent to SYJC of the Higher Secondary Board and Intermediate (Arts/Commerce/Science) of Maharashtra State Board or from other State Boards and immigrated from other Universities and Boards will be given admission to F.Y.B.A / F.Y.B.Com /F.Y.B.Sc. only on the submission of "Provisional Eligibility Certificate" issued by the University of Mumbai. Such students should submit migration certificate, statement of marks and passing certificate in original along with true copies within two months from the date of admission. Otherwise, their admission is liable to be cancelled.

F.Y. I.T. / C.S. -

Passed HSC (XIIth science) Examination with Mathematics as one of the subjects and should have secured minimum 45% marks in aggregate for open category candidates and 40% marks in aggregate in case of reserved category candidates.

F.Y. BMS / B.Com. (A & F) -

Passed HSC (XIIth standard) Examination with minimum 45% marks in aggregate in the first attempt only for open category candidates and 40% marks in aggregate in case of reserved category candidates.

S.Y / T.Y. (All Programs) -

Students coming from other college affiliated to the University of Mumbai will be given provisional admission only on submission of a "No Objection Certificate" with University PRN from the Principal of the college last attended. Their admission will be confirmed only on receipt of the Transfer Certificate (T.C.) from their previous college and availability of the subject combination. For this purpose, they should submit an application form along with T.C. fees to the College office at the time of admission.

A few seats may be available in certain subjects for the students from other colleges seeking admission to Second and Third Year classes.

- 9) In case, the original mark sheet of H.S.C. has been submitted for admission to any others college, a certificate endorsed by the Principal of the College must be produced.

Ph.D. Programs & Research Development Cell

A] Introduction:

As per the guidelines of UGC, the IQAC has formed Research Development Cell. The Cell has been working for the development of research culture among both the faculty members as well as students of the college by organizing various research events and also by participating in various research events organized by others. The Cell organizes different seminars, conferences and workshops from college to the national level. The faculty members and students are always motivated to undertake different research activities.

The Department of **Accountancy** and **Zoology Laboratory** have been recognized as the research centers for the degree of Ph.D. in Commerce (Accountancy) and Zoology respectively since the academic year 2022-23. Six seats of Ph.D. program for each department have been allotted for admission.

B] Eligibility:

- 1) **Ph.D. in Accountancy:** A candidate who has completed M. Com (Accountancy) program from any Indian University and has qualified UGC - National Eligibility Test [NET] or Maharashtra State Eligibility Test [SET] or Ph.D. Entrance Test [PET] of Mumbai University is eligible.
- 2) **Ph.D. in Zoology:** A candidate who has completed M. Sc. [Zoology] program from any Indian University and has qualified CSIR - National Eligibility Test [NET] or Maharashtra State Eligibility Test [SET] or Ph.D. Entrance Test [PET] of Mumbai University is eligible.

C] Course Outline:

As per the UGC and Mumbai University regulations, a candidate registered for the degree has to complete his/her research work and relevant procedure in a tenure of three years after University registration. A course work on 'Research Methodology' with relevant practical course and theory exam of 100 marks is mandatory for all the Ph.D. candidates. The registered candidate has to present at least two research papers in national or international conferences and has to publish two research papers in national or international journals which are UGC-Care listed. Besides, a registered candidate needs to submit his/her research progress report after every six months to the college authority through proper channel.

D] Research Areas:

- 1) **Ph.D. in Commerce and Accountancy:** Students can explore different areas in Accountancy such as Taxation, Finance, Auditing, Accounting and Costing as well as other relevant areas.
- 2) **Ph.D. in Zoology:** Students can explore different areas in Zoology such as taxonomy, anatomy, physiology, biodiversity, fishery and aquaculture, ornithology, herpetology, entomology, parasitology as well as other relevant areas.

E] Admission Procedure:

- 1] A candidate willing to seek admission should apply through a prescribed application available in the college / department.
- 2] The candidate will be called for an interview in front of Research Advisory Committee [RAC] of the college. The candidate has to present and justify his synopsis and plan of work to be sent for the final approval of Research and Recognition Committee [RRC] of Mumbai University.
- 3] If RRC approves the topic of research selected by the candidate, then only the candidate will be eligible for the final admission and University registration.
- 4] Once all the available six seats are admitted, next seat/seats can be admitted only after the completion of the degree course work of previously admitted student/students.

REFUNDS

❑ REFUND OF FEES

- Students, will be given admission to the College only after paying prescribed fees as per rules. Fees will be refunded after the cancellation of admission, as per University ordinance O.2859 or guidelines from time to time.

❑ REFUND OF DEPOSITS

- The amount of caution money, library deposit, laboratory deposit, if any, will be refunded when a student leaves the College or cancels admission. Deposits not claimed within six months from leaving the College or cancellation of admission will not be refunded / returned.
- The amount of deposits will be refunded to the student after 15 days from the date of receipt of his / her application duly signed by student and guardian.
- The students who do not submit their identity cards, original deposit receipts, must submit the same against the refund of deposits. Otherwise, he / she stands to forfeit the deposits. **Affidavit Bond will not be accepted at any cost.**
- Refund of deposits will commence after 15th August.

❑ REFUND OF FEES AFTER CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION: -

- A candidate who has taken admission in under graduate courses in the College may request for refund of fees by writing application for cancellation of his / her admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30 days after the date of cancellation. The percentage of fees for the programme shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

Period	Deduction
1. Prior to commencement of academic term	Rs. 500/- lump-sum
2. Upto 20 days after commencement of academic term	20% of the total fees
3. From 21 st day upto 50 days after commencement of the academic term	30% of the total fees
4. From 51 st day upto 80 days after commencement of the academic term or 31 st August whichever is eariler	50% of the total fees
5. From 1 st to 30 th September	60% of the total fees
6. After 30 th September	100% of the total fees

NOTE:

- The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the courses includes the following:
- All the fee items chargeable for one year are as per the circulars of University of Mumbai for different Faculties (Excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities.)
- The exam fee will be refunded excluding the University share.

DISCIPLINE

- Self-discipline is the best discipline. All students are expected to observe rules and regulations currently in force to enable the smooth working of the college.
- Students are strictly prohibited from doing anything inside or in the premises of the College that will interfere with its orderly administration or affect its public image. No outside influence, political or any other kind should be brought into the College directly or indirectly.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- Students should always carry their own valid college identity card whenever in college or representing the college at any other place. It should be produced whenever demanded by any of the College staff.
- During the conduct of lectures/practical/tutorials/exams, students should not wander in the college premises.
- All students are expected to observe / follow decorum with regards to both clothing and behavior.
- While representing the College at any other place, the students' behavior should not be detrimental to the image of the College.
- In case of any problem, personal or academic, students should report to the Teacher-in-Charge of their respective class or to the Principal of the college.
- Students are directed not to bring any outsider into the College premises.
- **Students should not collect any fund from other students or from outsider without the written permission of the Principal.**
- **Students should not organize picnics, excursions, trips, any celebrations etc. on their own without prior written permission from the Principal.**
- The power related to the disciplinary action in the college will remain with the Principal and his / her decision in this respect shall be final. Any one who disregards the code of conduct will be severely dealt with accordingly.
- **Ragging is strictly prohibited:** Government of Maharashtra has notified Ragging as a cognizable offence. Anyone reported to be involved in any form of ragging, will be liable for the punishment under State Govt./University Act. Therefore, students are required to restrain from involving in any form of ragging.
- **Students who request leave of absence from lectures/practicals/tutorials** for participating in sports, games, cultural or any other activities on behalf of the college/activity group, should submit the application countersigned by the respective Teacher-in-Charge in the office addressing to the Principal.
- Parents are requested to kindly contact the Teacher-in-Charge of the class, Head of Department or the Principal at least once in a semester, to keep themselves updated with their ward's attendance and progress.
- Students should not publish any material/information/article related to the College, management or any department in the College without prior written permission of the Principal.
- The students are expected to keep the College premises clean and neat. The infrastructure of the College should be appropriately used for self-development by the students. Students should not act towards the economical loss of the College in any respect.
- In case of students residing far away from the college, they may get a concession in S.T. fair to go home at the time of long duration holidays. The concession will be with respect to the address mentioned in the admission application.
- The Principal and Management of the College reserve the right to modify the code of conduct, if necessary in an appropriate and proper way. The same will be binding for all students.
- **Students should not bring with them any valuable thing or money, more than necessary. If lost, the College will not be responsible for loss of such things.**

2004. If any student is found while operating MOBILE in the campus, the Principal will take strict disciplinary action against him/her.

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING

■ **WHAT IS RAGGING?**

“ Any disorderly, whether by words spoken or written, or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, including in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise apprehension thereof in a fresher or junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or junior student.”

■ **Act / Ordinance**

UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009.

Punishment ingredients of Ragging.

- Abetment of ragging;
 - Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
 - Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
 - Wrongful restraint;
 - Use of criminal force;
 - Criminal trespass;
 - Criminal intimidation;
 - Criminal conspiracy to ragging
 - Public nuisance created during ragging;
 - Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
 - Wrongful confinement;
 - Extortion;
 - Offence against property;
 - Assault as well as sexual offence or unnatural offence.
- A. Attempt to commit any or all the above-mentioned offence against victim(s);
- B. Physical or psychological humiliation.
- C. All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging'.

Be it know to all that action shall be taken against those who are found in indulging in ragging as per

Recommendation of Raghavan Committee to Curb the Menace of Ragging Constituted By the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, which are as follows:

The punishment to be meted out has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents.

- Victim may lodge an FIR
- The institution must be an active party to lodge an FIR.
- Ragging Evidence: Act of ragging witnessed by teacher, non-teaching staff or administrative staff to be treated as final.
- In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he shall be expelled from educational institution.
- Anti-ragging committees and squad shall be formed by the institutions and it shall be the job of the committee or the squad, as the case may be, to see that the Committee's recommendations, more particularly those above observed without exception.

Punishment for Ragging:

Department on the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the college, those found guilty of ragging shall be liable for any one or any combination of the following punishment.

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension / expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institute for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000/- and Rs. 1 lakh.
- Imprisonment up to 3 years.
- In the case of offence of very serious / grievous nature, referring the case to the Police, in addition to any other punishment and / or collective punishment where the offence is committed collectively by a group or by a class making it difficult or not possible to identify specific persons.

Other Details

The institution shall file an FIR with the police / local authorities whenever a case of ragging is reported, but shall continue with its own enquiry and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police / local authorities. Remedial action shall be initiated and completed within the week from the incident itself.

The Migration Certificate / Transfer Certificate issued by an institution shall have an entry, apart from those of general conduct and behavior, if the student had involved in and /or punished for the offence of ragging.

Freshers are encouraged to report incidents of ragging. Those who do not do so even when being witnesses or victims shall also be punished accordingly.

■ Please Note:

Every student will give a written undertaking to the effect that he / she is aware of the law regarding ragging as well as the punishments, and that he/she if found guilty of ragging, is liable to be punished appropriately.

The parent/ guardian of the applicant will also give a written undertaking stating that he/she is aware of the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/her ward in case he/she is found guilty of ragging.

- Every student is expected to read and strictly follow the instructions given on the back side of the Reader's Ticket.
- In case of late return of the books, the students will have to pay a fine of Rs. 1/- per day for the first week and will have to pay Rs.2/- per day after that. In case of a serious default, the amount of fine may be increased up to Rs.25/- per day. If a student fails to return the book for three weeks in succession, then his/her borrower card will be cancelled for the whole academic year. New books will not be issued till the student pays the fine. While charging the fine, holidays will also be counted.
- Reissue of the books will depend upon the demand for the same.
- If a book issued, and is lost by a student, the student will have to pay two times to its present market price.
- The student should check properly the book which is being issued to him / her. Any complaint regarding torn book will not be entertained afterwards.
- If the book is not in a condition of issuing / borrowing, the student should bring the same to the notice of Library staff.
- Any disregard of these rules will be reported to the Principal for the appropriate action.

Passing Standards

- ii. A student shall be allowed to keep term of Sem. III if he/she passes (grade 'E' or above) or fails in not more than three courses, in each of Semester I and Semester II (For all Science Programmes carrying total 900 or more marks).
- iii. A student shall be allowed to keep term of Sem. IV irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Sem. III. However, student has to pass either of Sem. I and Sem. II in order to appear for Semester IV.
- iv. A student shall be allowed to keep term for Semester V if he/she passes Sem. I, Sem. II, Sem. III & Sem. IV
OR
He / she has passed Sem. I and Sem. II and fails in not more than three courses in each of Sem. III and Sem. IV. (For all Science programmes)
- v. A student shall be allowed to keep terms for Sem. VI irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Sem. V.
